

Letter To Ministers Urging The Funding Of Shovel-Ready Projects

Infrastructure spending will play a crucial role in our economic recovery, which is why we issued a letter to Ministers McKenna and O'Regan calling on the government to choose shovel-ready projects from the National Trade Corridors Fund administered by Transport Canada. Dozens of shovel-worthy projects were unsuccessful in previous calls for proposals. Legislation Supporting Students And Recent Graduates Progresses

The legislation required to enact the Canada Emergency Student Benefit (CESB) and the Canada Student Service Grant (CSSG) passed the House of Commons on Wednesday, including a \$250/month boost to the proposed CESB. The Senate will consider the legislation Friday, with the Government of Canada moving to implement the programs as quickly as possible once the bill becomes law. **Read The Media Coverage**
