Matthew's leadership extends across several organizations—he sits on the Board of Directors for Pow Wow Pitch, supporting Indigenous entrepreneurs, and is actively involved with the Chatham-Kent Chamber of Commerce and Family Services Kent, advocating for economic growth and social well-being.
